## March - GSR...your Group's link to A.A.

It's no coincidence that Chapter 1 in our General Service Manual is dedicated to the Group Service Representative (GSR). Our GSRs are the link between the group and the General Service Conference. A GSR is tasked with keeping the group informed on all things A.A. and sharing information from the group with the Delegate. Bill W. wrote in Concept I of The Twelve Concepts for World Service, "The A.A. groups today hold ultimate responsibility and final authority for our world services." So, what does that really mean?

The Groups are at the top of that upside down triangle for a reason. Bill W. and Dr. Bob realizing they would not live forever, decided to turn our fellowship over to the groups. Bill, Bob, and a few of the Oldtimers, were essentially at the top of the triangle where the groups are today. By turning that power over to the groups in 1950, we now have a structure where the groups can communicate and participate in decision making with the General Service Office, A.A. World Services, AA Grapevine, Inc, and our board of trustees, known as the General Service Board.

In Area 49, we have District, County and Area assembly meetings. This is where information is shared from the groups through their GSR to the rest of the general service structure. These meetings are also where GSRs gather

important information to take back and share with their group members. Our Area has over 2000 groups listed in the Fellowship Connection database at GSO. Of those registered groups, 1455 are active, 485 have an "unknown" status and 30 have an incomplete registration status. This means that 515 groups either don't have a GSR, group contact or other important information for GSO to connect directly to the group. These groups, although registered, are technically not part of the general service structure. This means their group does not have a voice or a vote.

When a group decides to participate in the general service structure, they elect a GSR. I would hope the group is careful to elect someone who is responsible, reliable, and trustworthy. This is because the GSR is expected to attend meetings and bring information back to the group. It is very important for the group to have a registered GSR, but it is also important for the GSR to take the commitment seriously. Don't be a GSR in name only! Does your GSR give a report at every business meeting? If not, why not? There is at least one general service meeting at the District, County or Area level each month. Your group GSR should ALWAYS have information to share with the group! The General Service Conference will be here before you know it and without a registered GSR your groups voice is silent.

About halfway through my first county meeting, the DCMC brought up that the Manhattan Share a Day chair had stepped down and asked for a volunteer to take the position. Crickets could be heard. So, I timidly raised my hand and said, "I'm a new GSR and would have no idea what I'm doing but I guess I could do it?" Thank God previous chairs had left notes on what to do and that this is AA so people are nice and understanding and helpful. One thing I was terrified of ever doing was being treasurer. I'm decent with money in my own life, but keeping track of a balance sheet??? Well, low and behold, a few months later the treasurer of my district ended her rotation. The DCM asked if anyone would doit and ... another awkward silence. As terrified as I was, I raised my hand.

I could continue on and on with anecdotes just like the above. I've often raised my hand to do a position just because no one else wanted to do it. I have usually been terrified, but the fellowship has carried me through it.

Now, I feel passionate about service below the group level. I've come to see how it is as integral to AA's survival as helping a newcomer. Sure, it can be boring at times, but AA completely changed my life. Doing service below the group level helps ensure AA's survival. So, I now look at servi ce below the group level as a way of practicing gratitude for the life that AA has given me, and it is a beautiful thing.



# THERE ARE NO COINCIDENCES

I was a NYC transit express bus operator and I usually dealt with the same riders every day. One day a rider left her briefcase on my bus. I wanted to save her the trouble of dealing with the lost and found, so I went through her bag, looking for a name and phone number. As I was going through her purse (I'm so embarrassed), I noticed that she was in the process of renewing her lease. I had all her important account numbers, social security number, and her address. I could have easily stolen her identity, but none of that was important to me. I remember pulling out a book from her purse that I'd never seen before. I had absolutely no idea what it was. It was a small booklet with maybe 50 -75 pages on newsprint paper. It was the AA meeting booklet for Brooklyn County. I don't think I was drinking alcoholically then, but as I held it I thought THIS! is important. Out of all the information in that briefcase, that was the one thing I thought I should hold on to. I called her so we could meet, and I could return her briefcase. I remember the look on her face. I now know It was the look of somebody whose anonymity had been violated. I didn't tell her what I found in her briefcase. She thanked me and left.

Sometime later, I was in a rehabilitation center in Kerhonkson, New York. There on the table with all of the pamphlets was an AA meeting book for upstate New York. That's when I realized what I had in my hand, it's value, and why it felt so important all those years ago when I found that briefcase. I returned to work after rehab and I remember looking for that woman whose briefcase I found and looked through. I never saw her again. There are no coincidences in recovery. I think it's ironic, even before I thought I was an alcoholic and holding that booklet, I knew it was something of value, something I should hold on to. Now that I know I'm an alcoholic and have a program in my life, I want to stay sober. I definitely know what to hold on to now.









