## Connecting with Love, Unity and Service

I never knew what love was until I came to Alcoholics Anonymous. Not right away of course. It took quite some time. What I found out over time was that I had to learn to love myself first before having the ability to love others – to have patience and tolerance and show kindness. Once I was capable of doing that for me, I was able to do that with everyone else. I never

used to like people, and now I feel unity when I’m in a meeting, sharing, setting up and helping others. It’s an amazing feeling that I would not have experienced had it not been for A.A.

Does anyone remember the blackout of 2003? I’ll never forget it. I was working in the city at the time. I walked from my office, and I wound up sitting on some subway steps right across the street from Penn Station. There was nowhere to go. Suddenly, an angel appeared out of nowhere. She sat with me on the subway steps. We both knew we weren’t
