Approval of Committee Meeting Minutes - Minutes Approved.

Reports:**Treasurer's Report - Rich S - treasurer@aaseny.org**

- Total Revenue for February was \$19,434
 - Consisted of 106 Contributions totaling \$ 18,559;
 - \$173 from the 7th Tradition basket at last month's Committee Meeting;
 - \$700 in Literature Sales at the January Assemblea.
- Year to date Revenue for the first two months of \$31,296 is 45% above budget - thank you to all the Counties, Intergroups, Districts, Groups and Individuals who have continued to support SENY. I'd particularly like to acknowledge two of our members, without naming them, who made Anniversary Club contributions – one for 43 years and the other for 54 years.
- Our expenses continue to be well below budget in every category. The major expenses were:
 - \$1,180 in Officer expense reimbursements;
 - \$1,500 for our monthly Office rent;
 - \$688 for Tech and Website expense;
 - \$860 for the annual renewal fee for our Quick Books account.
- The total expense was \$4,913 leaving a surplus for the month of \$14,521. This increased our operating account cash balance to \$103,421.84.
- Our Prudent Reserve and Special Event accounts were basically unchanged at \$127,118 and \$6,000, respectively, while our Convention account balance increased to \$20, 860 as registration and banquet fees continue to come in – a good omen for the upcoming SENY Convention at the beginning of April.

- I encourage our Committee Chairs to actively use their budgets to carry the message and to support the Area's groups.

Motion to pass Feb report - No opposed no abstentions. Feb report approved.

- I am also a Co-Chair, along with Sherry P., of the Hospitality Committee for this year's General Service Conference and we are still welcoming volunteers. Please reach out to Sherry or me if you'd like to participate.

Suffolk County and Nassau County continue to bring meetings virtually (Suffolk) and in person (Nassau) into their county jails whereas our state facilities are completely shut down until further notice. I will be speaking this week (3/8) with the regional coordinator assigned to our Area who hopefully will give us better news about where AA may fit into their volunteer schedule.
- Our Committee continues to communicate with Intergroups, regional coordinators and local program coordinators to learn the status of our programs in order for AA county reps and volunteers to be ready to carry the message when called upon as stated above. We continue to receive requests for outside volunteers to be connected to members on the inside and have sent those to our Corrections desk. We also have received several pre-release requests in February and have passed those on throughout the Area and the state to other Areas where those persons are to be released. I also renewed our PO Box for another year!
- We had a great conversation with our friend in PI to begin the process of hosting a writing workshop encouraging people in custody to share their stories for the Big Book.

Exploratory Committee Report - *Recommendations to Implement Hybrid Assemblies*

Background: The SENY Area 49 Exploratory committee was formed to evaluate the feasibility of re-opening in person meetings and assemblies by permanently implementing hybrid technologies.

Hybrid meetings address safety and health issues related to the Covid-19 pandemic, and further expand participation to members with accessibility concerns. This approach promotes inclusivity by:

- 1) Providing a safe environment for those members who choose to attend in person assemblies,
- 2) Providing a “virtual” online option for members who do not feel safe attending in-person events, and for members with accessibility concerns.

- I did purchase MP3 - not with group basket dollars
- Several things I heard that stood out:
 - Past Trustee & Panel 25 Delegate: Gen'l Svc structure does not carry the message; rather, we support those who do
 - DCM from another Area went to the mic and said he knew nothing about the Preamble change until one of his GSRs told him after last year's GSC
 - Past trusted servant presented something false as a fact at the mic (when Dr's opinion was moved to Roman numerals from page 1 of BB); a correction was sent just this morning
- It is very important for us all to distinguish between facts and our opinions as trusted servants

General Service Conference starts in 48 days..

- I was able to attend the 2nd half of the DDoS on Saturday and helped the Hispanic Districts with their presentation.
- We had the first of hopefully a series of writing workshops on March 6th to submit stories for the 4th Ed. Of the Spanish big book. I had copies of the delegates questionnaire in Spanish and gave them to Nelson to hand out. Hopefully additional workshops can be in English and Spanish, virtual and in person to be inclusive for all.
- I stopped by the office on the way to pick up the projector and screen for Amalia's presentation and the interpretation equipment for the upcoming JOS workshop. While there, I called Mel and offered to grab convention supplies which I will inventory and send a list to Mel, Bridgette the registration Chair and Eddie D. the hospitality Chair.

Thank you to our Technology Team: Justin K., Registration Chair, Derrick T., Email Admin; Saadi H., Postal Mail Coordinator, Claire M., our Web Chair, and Vicky B., Agenda Chair. And to those alcoholics who have stepped up to perform tech service across the Area, without which this and our other virtual gatherings could not function.

The tech committee is planning a Joy of Tech Service workshop to demystify tech service and encourage others to take up this service; to make it clear that you do not need special skills to perform tech service – all you need is a willingness to learn – and to talk about the joy and satisfaction of tech service. The workshop is tentatively set for September.

Due in large part to the crisis created by the pandemic we have a good number of Groups who have no GSR or Group contact in Airtable or Fellowship Connection, or whose GSR should have rotated out of service after Panel 69 or earlier. If you are a DCM, you may have already received an email identifying these Groups and asking you to find out whether they are currently meeting, either virtually or in physicality, and do they have a current GSR or Group Contact? This will allow us to properly update both Airtable and Fellowship Connection. It may also give us a better idea of how the pandemic altered the Fellowship in SENY. If you are a DCMC and have not yet received an email, you will soon.

I attended NERAASA as a Registrar and gave a report on the Registrar's roundtable. A major point of discussion both nights was virtual meetings. And last night Justin chaired the Registrar's informal monthly meeting, where virtual meetings again dominated the conversation.

The discussions included: Does virtual enhance participation. Some Areas, yes; some, who have returned to physicality, no - they get better participation with physical Assemblies. One Area has returned to physical Assemblies, with no virtual component, and told the Groups that their voice will not be heard unless their GSR can attend in person. Some put all virtual Groups into a new virtual District. And others are still sorting out their conscience about participation, including whether to include a virtual component if and when they return to physicality.
